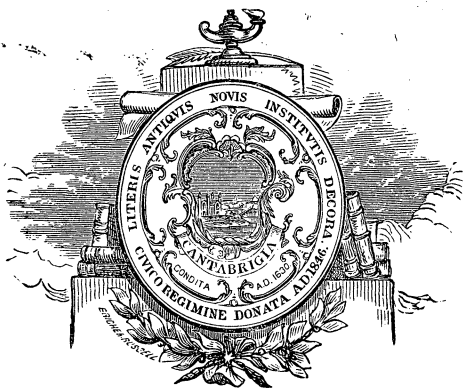




CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

IN BOARD OF ALDERMEN,

April 16 1883.

WHEREAS: It is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that

First Street
between Thurdike and Vine Streets

should be laid out as a public Street. Ordered that a strip of land

Fifty in width between *said Thurdike Street, and*
a point One Hundred feet Southwesterly, - also a
strip of land Sixty feet in width between the
point aforesaid and said Vine street,

included between the *red* lines as shown on a plan drawn by *Charles Miller,*
Engineer, dated December 1882,

and now before this Board, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street.

Ordered that *no* damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid, *the*
several owners and abutters having agreed in writing
to waive the usual notice, assent to the laying out
of said street, and to claim no damages therefor.
