- WHEREAS: On Saturday morning, January 19, 1991, the Cambridge Branch N.A.A.C.P. hosts its Annual Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Breakfast, at the Marriott Hotel, in Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: The Guest Speaker will be Sharon McPhail, a native Cantabridgian and attorney who now resides in Detroit, Michigan, where she is President of the National Bar Association Wayne County, Detroit, Michigan; and
- WHEREAS: The purpose of this annual gathering is not only to celebrate the life of Dr. King, but also to remind ourselves of the history of struggle and the persistence of hope that the Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday brings to us all; and
- WHEREAS: In the year just past, the president of the United States chose to veto important civil rights legislation which would have restored to their original strength laws that guaranteed long-denied equality of opportunity to African-Americans; and
- WHEREAS: Because Martin Luther King, Jr.'s Birthday, January 20th, is a National Holiday we are now all partners in history and it is in our hands to carry on his struggle for peace, equality, and social justice; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Council offers its congratulations to the Cambridge Branch of the N.A.A.C.P. on the occasion of the 6th Annual Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Breakfast, and join with those present in honoring Dr. King and his dream, in the words of poet Robert E. Hayden, "not with statues' rhetoric, not with legends and poems and wreaths of bronze alone, but with the lives grown of his life, the lives fleshing his dream of the beautiful, needful thing;"; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution for presentation to the Cambridge N.A.A.C.P.
