186 the Board of Aldermen acting upon
a petition therefor, of all the abutters upon Rice
Street, and duly meeting upon said street, and viewing

the street made a uniform width of Forty feet.
That said encroachments were duly corrected, and
the street graded, at the expense of the abutters,
and said street is now forty feet in width as
required - That owing to the neglect of furnishing
a plan of the street, it has never been formally
entered upon the rolls of the City as an accepted
street, wherefor the undersigned for himself, and the
abutters, submitting the enclosed plan, respectfully
prays that Rice Street may now be accepted,

and entered upon the rolls of the City, as
an accepted street, in accordance with
said Vote or Order.
