An Ordinance,
relating to the powers and duties of the School Committee.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows:

1. The School Committee are hereby authorized to elect and employ instructors for the Public Schools of the City, and determine the amount of their respective salaries.

2. The School Committee, in distributing the sum annually appropriated by the City Council for salaries of instructors in the public schools, shall so fix and graduate the amount of salary of each instructor, that the aggregate amount of all such salaries shall in no case exceed the sum so appropriated by the City Council.

3. The School Committee shall have the care of the School-houses of the City; they shall cause the same to be repaired, from time to time, and kept in good order; provide fuel for the schools, and all things necessary for the comfort of the scholars therein.
