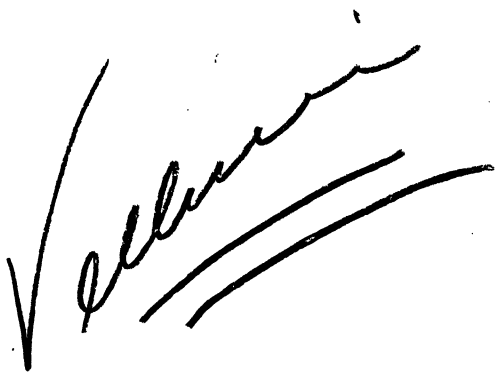

To the Cambridge City Council:

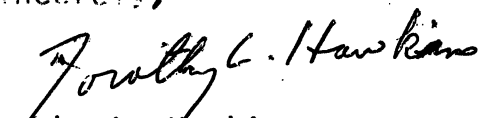
