RESOLVED:

That the Cambridge City Council pass a vote of heartfelt thanks to the Cambridge Rotary Club and other organizations for their efforts to beautify Cambridge, and be it further

RESOLVED:

That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to ask the Conservation Commission to form a new Council to Beautify Cambridge, consisting of appropriate city officials and residents:

increasing the variety of annuals, perennials, bulbs and shrubs in park and street areas now planted by the city.

making an inventory of parking lots, street corners and other public areas not now planted by the city and suggesting appropriate plantings.

considering the advisability of a program whereby private citizens or groups may adopt such areas and be responsible for planting and maintaining them.

sponsoring appropriate contests in the schools and among neighborhoods.

sponsoring clean - up efforts, and be it further

RESOLVED:

That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to consider allocating funds received from city recycling efforts to the purposes of this Council to Beautify Cambridge.
