If I can be of any further assistance, please let me know.

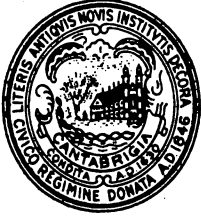


