COUNCILLOR WYLIE

- WHEREAS: In view of the reported action by the Cambridge Election Commission in notifying a number of City employees who allegedly live outside of Cambridge, that they will be dropped from the Cambridge voter's list unless they can prove eligibility to vote in Cambridge; therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the City Manager is requested immediately to notify all City employees who reside outside of the City that improper election practices will not be tolerated and that in addition to such enforcement action and penalties as other authorities may impose, personnel records will reflect proven examples of non-residents voting in Cambridge or mis-representing residency on annual census forms; and be it further
- ORDERED: That this City Council schedule a public hearing on this issue for Monday, October 29, 1979 at 6 P. M.; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to have the entire Board of Election Commissioners, City Solicitor and the Director of Personnel at this hearing.

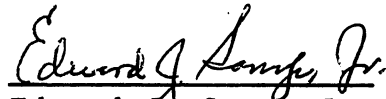
