RESOLVED: That this Council requests the City Manager to direct a letter to each party involved in the projected conveyancing of 380 Green Street, together with an engrossed copy of this resolution, requesting a status update on proceedings so that the City Manager is able to report back to the Council with the update's content no later than September 14, 1992 so that the Council membership can respond as is judged appropriate.
