- WHEREAS: The United States Congress has appropriated the sum of seventy-five million dollars for the construction of a new federal building which will be named in honor of the Speaker of the House, Thomas P. O'Neill, Jr.; and
- WHEREAS: Thomas P. O'Neill, Jr. is not only the 3rd most powerful man in our government as Speaker of the United States House of Representatives but is a lifelong Cantabrigian and our representative from the 8th Congressional District since 1953; and
- WHEREAS: The General Services Administration is currently reviewing various locations for the new federal building; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record inviting the General Services Administration to construct the federal building on the surplus "NASA" land adjacent to the Department of Transportation on Broadway; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Speaker O'Neill.
