*Bate Street, or called between

should be laid out as a public Street. Ordered that a strip of land

forty feet
in width between *Aron Hill Street and
Raymond Street,*

included between the *black* lines as shown on a plan drawn by *William W.
Whitney, C.E., and dated July 12, 1887,*

and now before this Board, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street.

Ordered that *no* damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid,
*the sole owner of abutting lands on said street having
waived the usual notice, and agreed to make no claim
for such damages.*
