At the same time the Cambridge City Council hereby confirms its policy of encouraging the use of State and Federal transportation monies for building an efficient mass transit system with the least possible damage for existing communities in Cambridge.

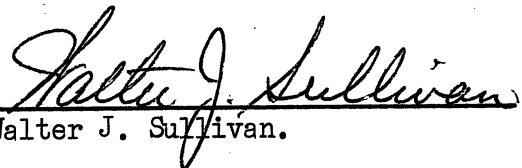
Dear Sir:-

Please be advised that on April 18, 1970 at 11:40 A.M. while participating in the Bicycle Parade sponsored by the Cambridge City Council in conjunction with the Bicycling Sub-Committee of the Cambridge Traffic-Safety Committee, I suffered severe injuries in my back and the lower regions of my body which resulted from a fall while participating in said parade, as a member of the City Council.

I was caused to fall in Peabody Square when an automobile, not part of the parade, interfered with the normal course of travel of the bicycle immediately preceding me, causing me to swerve to avoid a possible accident. As the result of this accident I was conveyed by the Rescue Team of the Cambridge Fire Department to the Cambridge Hospital where I was treated by Dr. Herbert.

Will you kindly notify the proper authorities and make the required notation in your records to establish this accident.

CAMBRIDGE BICYCLING WEEK

Saturday, April 18, 1970 - Opening Parade and Inauguration
at 11 A.M. from City Hall, Cambridge

The parade will move off at 11 A.M. from City Hall, Cambridge. Mayor Vellucci will be among those riding. The High Wheelers will be led by Dr. Ralph Galen. After a tour of some of the new BIKEWAYS the parade will return along Massachusetts Avenue to Cambridge Common, where the Mayor will declare the Cambridge Bicycling Week, the Bikeways, the new bicycle racks, and the safety-education campaign open.

Sunday, April 19, 1970 - Afternoon Ride - 1 P.M.

Meet at the home of Mr. Donald Blake, 1 Gleason Road, Bedford, for a 17-mile ride with the Charles River Wheelmen in commemoration of Patriot's Day. There will be an alternative 8-mile loop via the North Bridge and the Concord Battlefields where the British were entertained in the late unpleasantness.

Tuesday, April 21, 1970 - Evening Family Ride - 6 P.M.

A historical ride of up to ten miles (or less for anyone who wants to break off) around Cambridge, under the leadership of the Charles River Wheelman - Frank Williams, John Likins and Ralph Galen. Meet at Charles River Wheelmen headquarters - 131 Mt. Auburn Street, Cambridge.

Wednesday, April 22, 1970 - all day is ECOLOGY DAY

Join the many activities organized by Ecology Action and other groups. In the evening (8 P.M.) Bush Room - 10- 105 - MIT come to: "People Power - or, new developments in man-powered transport" talk illustrated by color movies and slides of man-propelled-vehicle racing and recent developments, by David Wilson.

Thursday, April 23, 1970 - Evening family Ride - 6 P.M.

A ride again starting from 131 Mt. Auburn Street, Cambridge, the headquarters of the Charles River Wheelmen, and including a ride around Fresh Pond. This ride will be led again by Frank Williams, John Likins and Ralph Galen.

Saturday, April 25, 1970 - Fresh Pond, Cambridge - (A.M. to 6 P.M.)

A century (or Less) ride for experienced adult riders (over 16) starting any time after 9 A.M. and ending anytime before 6 P.M. No entry fee, but all participants will receive a signed certificate from the City confirming the distance ridden and the time taken. Trophies will be presented to riders with the best times for 25, 50, and 100 miles. There will be a running commentary from a PA system; Dr. Ralph Galen plans to make his century atop a high wheeler. There will be events for youngsters and safety checking and adjustments 'Chick' Mead. Organizing chairman: Bernard Wiseman, CRW.
