Be it ordained by the City Council of the
City of Cambridge, as follows:-

1. All fines and penalties for ~~the~~ violation
of any ordinance of the city or any order
of the Mayor and Aldermen shall - when recovered,
enure to the use of the city, and shall be paid
into the city treasury, ~~except~~ unless it shall be
otherwise directed by the laws of the common-
wealth or the ordinances of the city.

2. All officers of the city shall enforce obedience
to ~~of~~ such laws of the Commonwealth, ordinances of
the city and orders of the Mayor and Aldermen as
