- WHEREAS: The Music Department of the Cambridge Public Schools presented a unique production of the classic Broadway musical "Oklahoma" on March 28 through March 31 at M.I.T.'s Kresge Auditorium with a cast of 900 high school and elementary school students serving as actors, dancers, musicians and singers in one of the most ambitious music-theater undertakings ever attempted in New England by public school students and faculty members; and
- WHEREAS: This production of "Oklahoma" captured all the excitement of the original Rodgers and Hammerstein musical in the best Broadway tradition and provided a superior learning experience for a large number of students; and
- WHEREAS: Their participation in this Broadway classic enriched the quality of education, total growth and development of all students in a project that required and encouraged the utmost cooperation of all concerned; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record congratulating Anthony Apicella, Director of Music Education, the members of the faculty who cooperated in this tremendous undertaking and the students who have given so unselfishly of their time and talents to make this production a grand success; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That a copy of this resolution be sent to Mr. Apicella and all concerned with this production to record the admiration of this City Council for this outstanding achievement.
