- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Kostas Babalas, late Cambridge resident and businessman; and
- WHEREAS: Kostas immigrated to America at the age of nineteen from Metilene, Lesbos, Greece and went to Iowa in 1912, where he went to work laying tracks, staying there for four years, at which time he went to Manchester, New Hampshire, where he and his brother Paul opened the Amoskeag Lumber Company, a business which they maintained for five years; and
- WHEREAS: Mr. Babalas came to Cambridge in 1921, where he owned and operated the Superior Restaurant in Central Square, and three years later, he opened the Paramount Restaurant in Waltham, operating at that location for twenty-six years until his retirement at age sixty-three; and
- WHEREAS: He was a man who loved life and enjoyed helping his family and friends, whether it be through a personal family crisis or just a day of fishing with his nephews; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Kostas' sons Paul, Charles and Peter and to the entire Babalas family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the family on behalf of the entire City Council.
