- WHEREAS: This City Council, through its Sub-committee on Linkage, is considering proposals to establish a linkage program in Cambridge for the purpose of providing additional units of affordable housing; and
- WHEREAS: Local non-profit and charitable organizations that provide health, social, educational, and religious services, or that builds or rehabilitates housing for low and moderate income residents, could be adversely effected by such a program, which would be contrary to the public good; therefore, be it
- RESOLVED: That the Linkage Sub-committee be directed to exempt from any future linkage requirements any facility developed by or for non-profit or charitable organizations, where said facility will be utilized specifically to provide health, social, educational or religious services, or to provide low and moderate-income housing, 4-6 owner occupied, and rehabilitating of units for the purpose of bringing up to code.
