In regard to a Council Order passed on January 29, 1973 concerning the Heavy Trucking Restriction on Rindge Avenue: I wish to inform you that the signs prohibiting this through truck traffic have been posted.

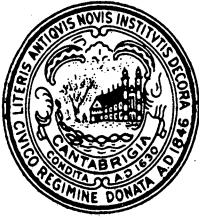
This restriction is one that is hard to enforce, as the restriction only pertains to those trucks who have no business in this area and who are using Rindge Avenue as a throughway from Massachusetts Avenue to Alewife Brook Parkway. As we know there are numerous businesses on Sherman Street who must use Rindge Avenue.

The only way a police officer can determine which trucks are using this street as a throughway, is to either follow them or stop them, and look at their bill of lading to determine if they have an origin or destination in the area.

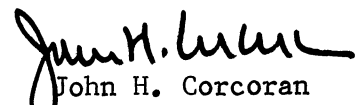
