WHEREAS:-

Under authority of an order of the City Council dated July 16, 1929 and approved by His Honor the Mayor on July 19, 1929 certain land on Elm Street, adjacent to the Fletcher School, was taken by right of eminent domain for school purposes, and

WHEREAS:-

At a meeting of the School Committee held on February 3, 1930 it was voted to recommend to the City Council that said land be transferred to the Board of Park Commissioners to be used as an addition to the present playground at the Fletcher School, it is therefore

ORDERED:-

That the parcel of land hereinafter described be and the same is hereby transferred to and put under the charge of the Board of Park Commissioners to be used for playground purposes. Said land is more particularly described as follows:-

SOUTHEASTERLY by Elm Street, fifty-six (56) feet;
SOUTHWESTERLY by land now or formerly of the City of Cambridge,
one hundred two and 35/100 (102.35) feet;
NORTHWESTERLY by said City land and land now or formerly of Mary
Traynor, fifty-five (55) feet;
NORTHEASTERLY by land now or formerly of Sarah Fiske,
one hundred two and 10/100 (102.10) feet.

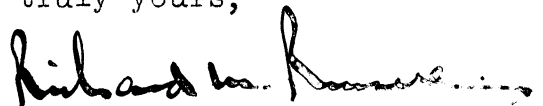
