On Saturday, February 14, 1976, Police Officers Joseph Cherubino and Edward Graham received a radio call to assist a child who had breathing difficulty at 929 Massachusetts Avenue, and

Upon arriving at the scene these officers discovered that, in fact, the child had stopped breathing, and

WHEREAS:

Officer Cherubino immediately began mouth to mouth resuscitation and mild cardiac massage in an attempt to revive this child, and

WHEREAS:

Officer Graham immediately began driving in a cautious but speedily manner to the Mount Auburn Hospital, making an attempt along the way to meet with Fire Rescue for their assistance, and

WHEREAS:

Officers Graham and Cherubino managed to get the child to the hospital and to a team of awaiting doctors and nurses who administered immediate medical attention, and

WHEREAS:

This child, Christopher Cosgo, regained the ability to breath and can now live a normal life, now therefore be it

RESOLVED:

That this City Council go on record extending our deepest gratitude to Officers Joseph Cherubino and Edward Graham for their outstanding performance and concern for this child, and be it further

RESOLVED:

That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a copy of this resolution to each officer and to the Chief of Police for inclusion in their personnel folders.
