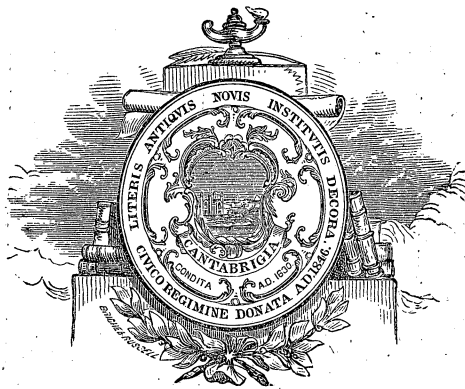

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Board, the safety and convenience of the inhabitants require that Arden Street,
from Linnaean to Shepard — Street
should be laid out as a public highway,

it is therefore hereby Ordered, that due notice be given to Edmund Smith,
E. H. Brabrook, Joseph A. Wellington, George C. Piper,
J. W. Black, W. A. Gorham, Charles H. Saunders, Heirs of
W. E. Carter, Isaac Sprague, Arthur Merrill, and
H. H. Stimpson
that this Board intends to lay out the Street before mentioned, by taking a
portion of their land and laying out the same as a public street — and that
Wednesday, the eleventh day of May next, at 8 o'clock,
P. M., is assigned as the time for hearing any objections which may be made thereto.
