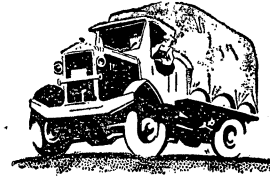
I am enclosing herewith Mr. Bishop's petition which is self-explanatory.

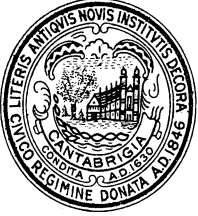
I am enclosing a check for \$170.00, which <sup>is</sup> the betterment fee.


