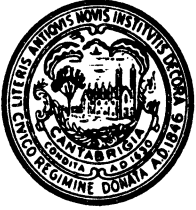
Subject City Council Order #18 of June 26, 1989 "Concord Ave. & Spinelli Way

The Traffic Department has conducted a survey of Concord Avenue from Alewife Brook Parkway to Blanchard Road and are in the process of upgrading the signal at the Neville Manor and Moulton Street to a full stop and go signal with an exclusive pedestrian phase. This will allow a gap in traffic which in turn will allow vehicles to enter and leave Spinelli Way.

I will however re-study this intersection to determine if it meets the warrants set forth in the Uniform Manual For Traffic Control Devices which were adopted by the federal and state government.
