Our teeth are getting shaken out by the condition of Lincoln Lane. The stretch between the apron on Fayerweather Street and the circle at the end of the lane has been patched so often virtually nothing is left of the original paving, and the patches are fast getting taken over by potholes. Drivers of the City snowplows and sweepers have demurred at coming in here, on the grounds that the lane is too rough on their equipment.

Some nine years ago we were told that the City would repave the lane the following spring. How much longer do we have to wait? As owners and residents of the five houses opening on Lincoln Lane we invite you to inspect it for yourself, but for your own comfort we advise you to park outside and walk.




