- WHEREAS: The educators will visit public, private and charter schools, discuss issues with American educators and learners in urban, suburban and rural communities, interact with institutions of higher education and non-profit organizations; and
- WHEREAS: Participants in this visit will talk with faculty, students, parents, directors, superintendents, principals and content specialists to emphasize that learning is a partnership. Local educators from over fifteen organizations will discuss their best practice and current challenges with the visitors; and
- WHEREAS: On Tuesday, May 15, 2001 Cambridge-Yerevan Sister City Association will host a reception welcoming the ten education professionals from Syunik, Armenia at the Sheraton Commander Hotel, Terrace Room located at 16 Garden Street; now therefore be it
