WHEREAS: On the 100th anniversary of the first Hague International Peace Conference in the Netherlands, non-governmental organizations from around the world are convening "The Hague Appeal for Peace" a gathering to "delegitimize armed conflict and create a culture of peace for the 21st century." The event is drawing more than two thousand five hundred participants from all the continents including many from the United States. Organized around the four themes of humanitarian and human rights, root causes of war and a culture of peace, disarmament, and nuclear abolition, and the prevention, resolution and transformation of violent conflict, the Hague Appeal has an entire program strand for youth; and

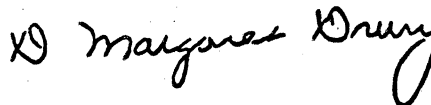
