Dear Sir:

Regarding the Patrol Schedule of the Dog Officer for the Fresh Pond Recreational area requested by Councillor Preusser, please be aware that effective immediately the Animal Control Officer assigned to the upper part of the City will patrol the grounds of the Fresh Pond Reservation (Water Department) at the following times and shall note the same on their Activity Sheet. When only one Animal Control Officer is working, the same will apply. Calls shall be taken from the above location, answered and noted on Activity Sheets. The following schedule applies seven (7) days a week: in the day time from 1:00 p.m. to 3:45 p.m., the Dog Officer will be up and around Fresh Pond and taking his calls from that location; in the night period, it shall be from 4:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. or if it does not get dark until later, it shall be 'til the later time when the first show of darkness arrives.

But, I might suggest to you, Mr. City Manager, at this point in time that consideration be given as to the posting of this area and it should be posted, in my belief, with the thought in mind that Cambridge residents and Cambridge residents only should avail themselves to the use of this area. As you must be well aware, from observation or from information furnished, if one were to look at the motor vehicles

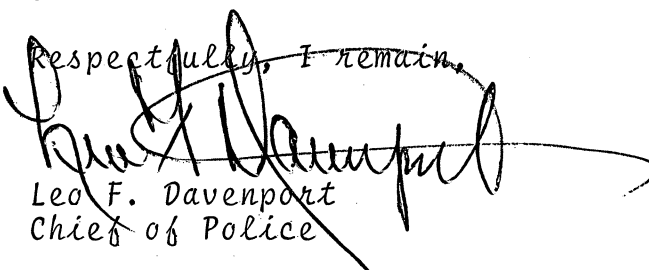

in that general area, we would find that they are most out of town residents, they are either out of town or out of state, and this can be ascertained by the tags on the vehicles or the stickers in the window.

Together, I would suggest further that animals not be allowed off the leash in this area because it proves a very hazardous condition for those who are attempting to exercise by sprinting or running around the Pond. So, it should further state in regard to residents only - dogs unattended shall be subject to seizure by the Animal Control Officers and that they should, while on the premises of the Water Department i.e. the City of Cambridge, be on a leash.

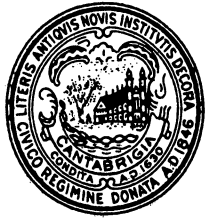

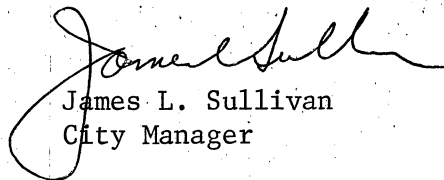
