COUNCILLOR RUSSELL:

- WHEREAS: Numerous senior citizens living in our elderly housing complexes are at risk both physically and emotionally for various reasons; and
- WHEREAS: Many of them would benefit from the presence of a social worker who could "draw them out" of their apartments and "main stream" then with their peers; and
- WHEREAS: The Housing Authority is not equipped to handle this type of operation; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager confer with the Director of the Council on Aging with the view in mind of looking into the feasibility of providing some services, even if on a part-time basis, by joining with the Governor's Employment training program or some other such program and report back to the City Council as soon as possible.
