SECTION 16.101. PROJECTIONS OVER STREETS;¹ PERMIT; FEE. No sign, advertising device, clock, marquee, barber pole, stationary or movable, permanent awning or other like structures, projecting into or placed on or over the public highway a distance of more than twelve inches, except poles, wires, conduits and appurtenances of telegraph and telephone, water, gas, electric light, heat and power companies and public transportation authorities shall be placed or maintained in any public way until a permit therefor has been granted by the City Council. The permit shall be issued by the Commissioner of Public Works and the fee shall be One (\$1.00) Dollar. (G.O. 1943, c. 30, sec. 1, as amended by G.L., c. 85, sec. 9)

SECTION 16.102. CONNECTION WITH BUILDINGS. All signs, advertising devices, clocks, marquees, barber poles, permanent awnings, and other like structures shall be constructed, and, when attached to the building, shall be connected, therewith in accordance with the requirements of the building ordinances of the City. (G.O. 1943, c. 30, sec. 2)

SECTION 16.103. BONDS. Any person granted a permit under this Chapter shall file a bond with the City Clerk in such amount as shall be fixed by the City Council with surety to be approved by the City Auditor and in form to be approved by the City Solicitor, so as to indemnify and save harmless the City from all claims, costs, damages or judgments resulting from or incident to or arising out of the issuing of permits. SECTION 16.104. PENALTY. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this Chapter shall be subject to a fine not exceeding Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars, and each day the violation continues shall constitute a new and separate offense. (G.O. 1943, c. 30, sec. 4)
