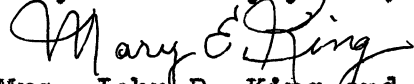
As a Father and Husband, he was just marvelous, incredible, firm, loyal and dependable. I know, as his wife, nothing in this world will ever replace him.
