Dear Mayor Crane:

The New York, New Haven & Hartford Railroad Company has filed with the Interstate Commerce Commission a notice of discontinuance of all interstate passenger trains. This notice will affect all persons in your community using this service.

This office is presently representing the Commonwealth in proceedings before the Interstate Commerce Commission in Washington, in opposition to this notice. Regional hearings will be held in Springfield at 9:30 a.m. on January 10, 1966, in the U. S. Post Office Building; and in Boston on January 17, 1966, at 9:30 a.m. in the Gardner Auditorium. These hearings are for the purpose of allowing those communities and persons affected by this service to present their views with regard to its discontinuance.

The Commission values the views of those persons affected by this service. If you feel that this service should be continued, you should attend the hearing in person. If this is not possible, a statement by you or your organization should be read into the record of the hearing. Popular support is essential to the continuance of this service.
