- WHEREAS: Justice Margaret H. Marshall was confirmed as Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts by the Executive Council on Wednesday, October 13, 1999; and
- WHEREAS: Justice Marshall is the first woman to be appointed Chief Justice in the Supreme Court's three hundred year history and the first woman to head any of the three coequal branches of state government in Massachusetts; and
- WHEREAS: Chief Justice Marshall while a college student in her native South Africa led national student opposition to apartheid; and
- WHEREAS: Chief Justice Marshall has a distinguished record of community, academic and professional service and achievement; and
- WHEREAS: Chief Justice Marshall is a resident of Cambridge, together with her husband, Anthony Lewis, a noted journalist and author; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council expresses its special pleasure in the appointment of Chief Justice Marshall, admiration as this appointment is added to her many earlier accomplishments and special pride in the distinction it brings to Cambridge; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council also expresses its confidence that Chief Justice Marshall in leading the court system of the Commonwealth will succeed in meeting the many and varied challenges this new position offers; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk is requested to send this resolution to Chief Justice Marshall on behalf of the entire City Council with its best wishes and congratulations.
