

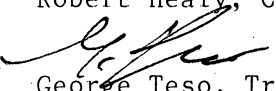

**Subject** City Council Order #16 of Sept. 17, 1990 re: Speeding on Rindge Avenue.

The Traffic Department has completed a speed study on Rindge Avenue in the area of Rindge Towers and find that the existing legal posted speed limit is 25 M.P.H. We checked a total of 390 vehicles and found that the average speed was 30 M.P.H. A further check of the speed study revealed that 338 vehicles, or 87% of the vehicles checked exceeded the speed limit.

We have installed new signs and replaced worn signs in this area and have reported the results of this study to the Police Department for enforcement.

This area is also being considered for a Traffic Signal and will be placed on our priority list when our study is completed.
