To the Honorable Mayor and
Aldermen of the City of Cambridge:

The undersigned Citizens of Cambridge and residents of Franklin Street, would respectfully petition your Honorable Body that said Franklin Street, between Pleasant and Putnam Streets, be accepted by the City and made in a safe condition for travel. The street has been open as a public highway for twenty-three years, during which time nothing has been done towards repairing it; the City now owns eight feet in the centre of the street for a drain, and this is the very worst part of the street. As soon as a sidewalk is made, it is cut away by teams driving on it, as it is almost impossible for a team to get through the middle of the street.

In Board of Aldermen, July 15 1868

The Committee on Health to whom was referred the Petition of Walter Hackett & others, for the acceptance of Franklin St between Pleasant & Putnam Streets, and to make the same safe for public travel - together with Report of Committee on Roads & Bridges on same Petition - have attended to the duty assigned them & would respectfully - Report -

Your Committee have visited the locality several times, and find there is a large amount of work required to make that portion of Street in Condition for the City to accept & to relieve the petitioners. Your Committee do not see any way that the difficulty can be removed at present; the large Drain now constructing on Western Avenue, when extended to the immediate neighborhood of locality under Consideration, will place this territory in Condition to be drained & graded - when so graded to the Satisfaction of Supt of Streets, Your Committee would recommend that the same be accepted by the City.

As this work cannot be accomplished at

Present, Your Committee recommend, that the Petition, together with Report on same be laid on the Table, or placed on file, until such time as a remedy can be applied
