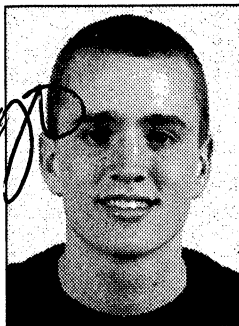

Clarkson blanks punchless Eagles

out of St. Louis and the Detroit Junior Red Wings, but his patience and persistence has paid off the past two years at Clarkson.

"It came down to myself and one other guy, and they opted to give him the scholarship," said Rogles. "I didn't play a whole lot my freshman year. There were three of us rotating my sophomore year. Then it all started to come together last year."

He was the man in the eye of the storm for his up-and-down team and came up with 45 saves yesterday, as the Golden Knights (4-3-1) shut out Boston College (3-4-3) for the first time since Feb. 13, 1981, with a 6-0 triumph at Kelley Rink that kept first-year coach Steve Cedorchuk winless (0-3-1) on home ice. The Eagles outshot the Golden Knights, 45-24, and had a 19-6 advantage in the second period.

"We had a lot of shots, but we didn't get any rebounds," said Cedorchuk. "Early in the game, [Rogles] made some good saves. I think Friday night [a comeback 6-6 tie with St. Lawrence] took a little out of our team. For our team to get 45

failed to capitalize on power-play opportunities for 6:06 of the period while trailing, 1-0. Todd Marchant then cut in from the left side and tucked the puck behind goaltender Josh Singewald to make it 2-0 at 15:59 of the second. Martin d'Orsonenes provided his team with a 3-0 lead with 34 seconds left in the period when his blistering shot from the top of the circle went in.

"It was demoralizing," said Cedorchuk, who was an assistant to retired Len Ceglarski for 17 years before taking over the helm. "That happens sometimes. We didn't have the zip we did on Friday night. We're going to have to learn from our mistakes. We've got to keep them upbeat and point toward the end of the season. Our goal has always been to play our best in February."

Rogles earned his first shutout in two seasons. His team, which has won four games by a combined score of 33-3 and lost three by a combined tally of 11-8, was its upbeat best yesterday to improve to 3-1 vs. Hockey East foes.

"We've definitely been riding a roller coaster," Rogles said. "The potential's there. We've got some great goal-scorers if we can just tighten up and be more consistent with our
