To the Honorable the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Cambridge:

The undersigned, a resident on the corner of Craigie and Sparks Streets, respectfully petitions that he may be allowed to lay, during the coming summer, along his frontage on both said streets, a paved walk of the best North River Blue Stone, each stone on Craigie Street to be not less than four feet six inches long, and on Sparks Street not less than four feet long, and on both streets not less than two feet wide, smooth on its face, and in no place less than two and one half inches thick, to be chiseled on all four edges not less than one half an inch down from the top and perpendicular thereto, and so trimmed on the two longest edges as to make close joints, and free from drill holes.

The same to be laid and maintained at his own expense.
