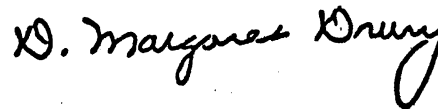

Brunch benefits hunger relief

Greater Boston restaurants with nationally-known chefs Stan Frankenthaler, Jimmy Burke, Jody Adams and Lydia Shire will serve a special

lunch at their respective eateries Sunday, Jan. 18, from 11 am to 2 pm.

The Super Hunger Brunch, sponsored by the Greater Table, will benefit the Greater Boston Food Bank, OXFAM America and Fork In The Road. All of the food, champagne, labor, facilities and coffee have been donated, guaranteeing that 100 percent of the ticket proceeds will go to the benefiting organizations.

Priced at \$25 and \$15, depending on the restaurant, the champagne brunch includes a choice of appetizers, entrees and premium sparkling wines. For more information, call the Greater Boston Food Bank at 427-5200 or call the following participating restaurants.

Several Cambridge restaurants are contributing: Brew Moon, 426-4466; Cafe Celador, 661-4073; Cambridge Common, 547-1228; Christopher's, 876-9180; Fusilli, 661-1600; Green Street Grill, 876-1655; John Harvard's Brew House, 868-3585; Rialto, 661-5050; Salamander, 225-2121; and Salts, 876-8444. Coffee is being donated by Starbucks.

"Last year this three-hour event raised over \$100,000," said Matthew Rönner, vice president of the Greater Table. "This year we hope to attract more diners and raise even more money for hunger relief."

The Greater Table is a nonprofit alliance of greater Boston restaurants

working to raise funds for hunger relief through events, promotions and corporate participation programs.

The Greater Boston Food Bank, New England's largest domestic hunger relief organization, is a nonprofit clearinghouse for food donated by the private sector and services more than 700 member agencies which feed 465,000 hungry people every month. It is also a member of Second Harvest, a national network of food banks, which specializes in food recovery.

OXFAM America is an independent, nonprofit international agency that works with poor people in Africa, Asia, Latin America and the Caribbean. It supports more than 200,
