- WHEREAS: High levels of air pollution are detrimental to the health and well-being of the citizens of Cambridge, and clean air should be valued as a precious natural resource enhancing the image of our city as a place to live and work; and
- WHEREAS: The chief source of air pollution in Cambridge is the automobile, and care must be taken to strike a balance between the right of the citizen to operate a motor vehicle and efforts to control hazardous emissions; and
- WHEREAS: Local participation in air quality planning is a central feature of the Clean Air Act of 1977 which mandates the greater Boston area to meet national air quality standards by 1982; and
- WHEREAS: The Metropolitan Area Planning Council and the Governor of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts have proclaimed September, 1980 as Clean Air Month; and
- WHEREAS: To help celebrate this event, the City of Cambridge will on September 30, 1980 sponsor a free auto emission test open to all concerned owners of motor vehicles, and a bicycle commuter caravan into downtown Boston; therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the members of the Cambridge City Council do hereby proclaim Tuesday, September 30, 1980 as Clean Air Day in Cambridge, and urge that all Cambridge citizens take cognizance of this event and participate fittingly in its observance.
