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NEW MAYOR'S PLEA:

Clean Up Our City

GALWAY'S FIRST lady mayor in nine years has vowed to crack down on the litter bugs who are ruining the image of Galway city.

Fine Gael councillor Angela Lupton, who was elected Mayor of Galway by the slenderest of margins at Monday night's meeting of the Galway City Council, said that when she was elected mayor in 1989 she hit out at the littering of the streets of Galway.

"Here we are, nine years on and still talking about litter. My biggest message to the people of Galway is to start talking pride in their city. Instead of knocking everything that goes on in Galway, people should make the effort to clean up the city.

"I would ask business owners to sweep outside their premises a couple of times a day, people to use the rubbish bins provided and for people to generally take pride in the city they live

in," she said in her maiden speech as Galway's first citizen.

Lupton, who was mayor of the city on one other occasion from July 1989 to July 1990, said it was time people started appreciating what people are trying to do for the city.

"There have been a lot of changes in this city over the past 10 years or so, changes that possibly came too quick for my generation and those older. But it has happened, and in many ways it is for the better.

"If you think back those 10 years there were a lot of derelict buildings in the city. Now we have a thriving city centre with vibrant streets, stretching from Forster Street at one side of the city to Quay Street on the other side,"

she said.

She also commented on the fact that this may be the last time the city council elects the Mayor of Galway as the idea of a public election for mayor appears to be gathering popularity.

She said she recently looked back at the *Hardiman History of Galway* and found that a Lynch has been mayor of Galway on over 80 occasions. She said she wants to see the name Lynch back on the mayoral chain of office, and as a result, for her term in office she was going to use the name Angela Lynch Lupton.
