WHEREAS: The June 26, 1990 correspondence from Her Honor, the Mayor, to Carl F. Barron, a copy of which City Council members received and is attached hereto, regarding the status of a permanent CASPAR sponsored Emergency Service Center at the Albany Street site indicates that, talk aside, the matter is dead in the water; and

WHEREAS: On April 12, 1990 the full membership of this City Council adopted and added their names to my proposed Sense of the City Council Resolution, (a copy of which is attached) wherein it was affirmed that "...if there is no positive step taken by Massachusetts Institute of Technology by the end of April, 1990 to further the presence of a permanent shelter on the land in question, the City Manager is to begin the preliminary steps required for the City to take the property through eminent domain proceedings as being necessary for the welfare of the City of Cambridge"; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That during the intervening period, the City Manager be and hereby is requested to utilize surplus funds for the purchase of new trailers to house these unfortunate individuals; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager initiate those steps immediately, advise the President of Massachusetts Institute of Technology accordingly and provide a status report on this matter to this City Council by September 10, 1990 with a subsequent report each month thereafter.

RESOLVED: It is the sense of this City Council that the time for delay has passed and the time for decisive action is now so far as a determination on the part of M.I.T. to donate the parcel of M.I.T. land to CASPAR, Cambridge and Soemrville Program for Alcoholism Rehabilitation, on which the CASPAR sponsored Emergency Service Center has been located within temporary trailers. The urgency for the need of a permanent shelter is self-evident. The tragic failure wrought by this continued delay is self-evident in the forfeiture, with only a thread of hope for its restoration, of the \$2.5 million grant awarded to CASPAR by the Commonwealth's Executive Office of Communities and Development. A permanent shelter on that site is central and not accidental to the life of this city; and be it further

RESOLVED: It is the sense of this City Council that if a deaf ear continues to be the response given to prior resolutions from this City Council this same matter, and if there is no positive step taken by M.I.T. by the end of April, 1990 to further the presence of a permanent shelter on the land in question, the City Manager is to begin the preliminary steps required for the city to take the property through eminent domain proceedings as being necessary for the welfare of the City of Cambridge; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a duly engrossed copy of this resolution and forward same to Dr. Paul Gray, President of M.I.T.

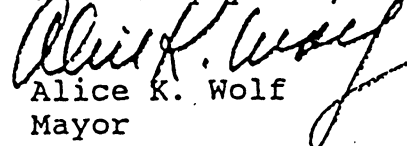
Dear Carl:

As we agreed at our May 11 meeting regarding the CASPAR shelter, my office arranged a meeting with M.I.T. President Paul Gray to discuss Albany Street as a permanent site for the shelter. On June 21, 1990, City Manager Robert Healy, Assistant City Manager for Human Services Jill Herold, Executive Director of Cambridge Housing Authority Dan Wuenschel, CASPAR Director Sally Duncan, and I met with President Gray. We made strong arguments both for the need for the shelter and its continued location at the Albany Street site.

President Gray expressed his reservations. However, he agreed to take our recommendations under advisement and will be getting back to us.

I will, of course, keep you informed. In the meantime, I urge you to contact my office if you know of any other appropriate sites for CASPAR or if you have other ideas for urging M.I.T. to meet this urgent need.
