

City of Cambridge,

In the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three.

An Ordinance,

in addition to "an Ordinance for the removal of nuisances, sources of filth, and causes of sickness, within the City of Cambridge."

Be it ordained, by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows:—

No person shall drive, or cause to be driven, any cart or waggon containing night-soil, or any waggon or cart used for that purpose, through any street, lane, or alley, in the City, between the hours of four o'clock A.M. and nine o'clock P.M.; nor permit any such waggon or cart to stand, between said hours, in any street, lane, or alley, in said City. And any person, who shall offend against the provisions of this Ordinance, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding twenty dollars, for each and every such offence.
