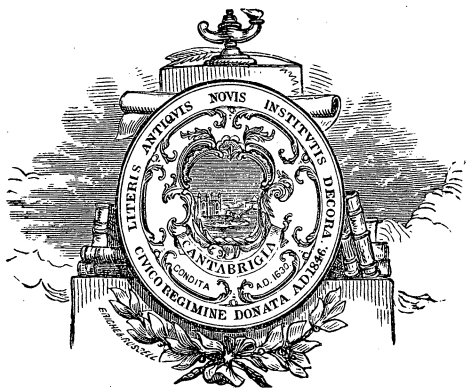




CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

IN BOARD OF ALDERMEN,

May 5, 1885

WHEREAS: It is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that *White Street, so-called, from*
Somerville
North Avenue to the passage-way known as Cottage
Court,

should be laid out as a public Street. Ordered that a strip of land *thirty*
feet in width between *said Somerville*
North Avenue and
said passage-way,

included between the *red* lines as shown on a plan drawn by *W. A. Mason & Co.,*
Surveyors, dated June 30, 1884,

and now before this Board, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street.

Ordered that *no* damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid, *the*
several owners of estates abutting upon the described
street, having in writing waived the usual notice, and
agreed to claim no damages therefor.
