YOUTH EMPLOYMENT PROJECT SUMMER TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM

INTRODUCTION

The Summer Transportation Program will provide up to fifty (50) youths with transportation to and from jobs at the Army Corps of Engineers Center on Trapelo Road, Waltham and at Hanscom Field Air Base in Bedford. The program will assume only the transportation costs (the rental of one bus) for a ten week period during the months of June, July, and August.

The jobs for fifty (50) youth are subsidized by the Summer Aid Programs at both military installations. They are full time appointments for the summer and the youths are paid \$1.85 per hour. The actual jobs are in offices, in laboratories, in workshops, and out of doors.

GOAL

The key goal of this program is to provide safe, low-cost, and speedy transportation by bus to the two job sites. The available public transportation to both locations is circuitous, costly, and time consuming.

STAFF

No additional staff will be needed to coordinate this program. Youth Employment Project staff have coordinated the job search, the interviewing, and the placement. They will oversee the program during the summer.

JOB SITES

The Corps of Engineers Center works from 8:00-4:30. Hanscom Field works from 8:30-4:00. These are 12 summer jobs at the Engineer's Center, 15 work-study jobs at Hanscom, and 20 summer jobs at Hanscom. Based on \$1.85 per hour and 40 hours per week for 10 weeks, the two federal installations will pay approximately \$35,000 in salaries to these Cambridge youth.

The jobs are ready for the youth on Monday, June 18, 1973 or any succeeding Monday. The program will run for 10 weeks.

The youths selected for these jobs have all been certified by the Massachusetts Division of Employment Security as meeting the Poverty Level Income Criteria established by the Department of Labor and Office of Economic Opportunity.

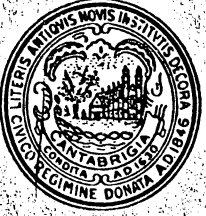


To the Honorable, the City Council:
