INFORMATION CONCERNING INTER-CITY CB ASSOCIATION OF MASSACHUSETTS

This new association is now in the embryo stage, and if the response is favorable, we will initiate steps to charter this organization. The following paragraphs will explain the functions of our association, and if this interests you, contact the person who gave you this for further information.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this association is to provide CB radio communication assistance for the local fire stations, law enforcement officials, civil defense agencies and chartered organizations. This does not mean however, that we take the role of, or play the part of, these establishments, neither does it mean that we take command of any emergency situation that arises. In essence, it does mean, that we will assist any emergency situation under the direction of that organization if it needs our help.

MEMBERSHIP

The membership is composed of people (18 years or older) that live in the cities and towns north of Boston to Stoneham, and east of Watertown to Revere. These people will be governed by a presidential body of that city, and that presidential body will report with the other cities at a central source to resolve and improve communications throughout the association.

AIMS

The aims of this non-profit association is to serve the cities and towns we live in. We will assist in organized search parties in the case of a lost child or person, emergency traffic control, breakdowns on streets and highways and report subversive activities that ravage our streets with crime. Other avenues of assistance from outside sources will be considered upon the vote of the membership. The sole intension of this association is to better the communities we live in, through the CB media, and will not direct any efforts of becoming a Vigilante association. Furthermore, the association at this time has recommended that our efforts be cast at our leisure time, and not become a tightly oriented group.

THE CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I: THE NAME OF THIS ASSOCIATION SHALL BE INTERCITY
"CB" ASSOCIATION OF MASSACHUSETTS.

ARTICLE II:

- (A) THE PURPOSES AND EFFORTS OF THIS ORGANIZATION IS TO AID THE COMMUNITIES WE LIVE IN. WE WILL PROVIDE RADIO COMMUNICATION DIRECT TO THE POLICE STATIONS FOR THE SOLE PURPOSE OF INFORMING THEM OF ANY SUBVERSIVE ACTIVITIES LABELED AGAINST THE SAFETY OF OUR CITIES AND TOWNS, AND THE PEOPLE THAT LIVE THERE. THIS DOES NOT MEAN HOWEVER, THAT WE ENFORCE THE LAW, BUT MERELY ACT AS OBSERVERS TO REPORT SUBVERSIVE ACTIVITIES TO THE POLICE.
- (B) TO ADHERE AND PROMOTE ETHICAL PRACTICES SET FORTH BY FCC PART 95.
- (C) TO COOPERATE WITH OTHER ESTABLISHED ORGANIZATIONS SUCH AS: MOBILE ASSISTANCE PATROL, GENERAL SUBURBAN AID, REACT, CIVIL DEFENSE UNITS, FIRE HOUSES, ETC.
- (D) TO REPORT FIRES, ACCIDENTS, BREAKDOWNS AND ANY OTHER INCIDENTAL FACTORS THAT WOULD REQUIRE OUR ASSISTANCE FOR GOVERNMENTAL OFFICIALS.
- (E) THIS ASSOCIATION WILL LEND ITS SERVICES AT THE EXPENSE OF EACH MEMBER, AND WILL BE DEEMED A NON-PROFIT ASSOCIATION.
- (F) ALL MEMBERS WHO ABIDE BY THE CONSTITUTION AND ITS ARTICLES WILL DO SO AT THEIR OWN RISK AND EXPENSE.
- (G) THE INTER-CITY "CB" ASSOCIATION WILL NOT BE HELD RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY DAMAGE, LOSS OF PROPERTY, OR ANY PERSONAL INJURY OR LOSS OF LIFE RESULTING FROM AN ACCIDENT OR ANY OUTSIDE SUBVERSIVE FORCE WHILE ENFORCING THE ARTICLES OF THIS CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE III: OFFICERS:

- (A) THE OFFICERS OF THE ASSOCIATION SHALL CONSIST OF: ONE PRESIDENT, ONE VICE PRESIDENT, ONE SECRETARY-TREASURER AND TWO BOARD MEMBERS FROM EACH CITY. FURTHERMORE, THERE SHALL BE ONE CO-ORDINATOR FOR ALL THE CITIES INVOLVED.
- (B) TERM OF OFFICERS: THE OFFICERS SHALL SERVE A TWO YEAR TERM, AND NOT SERVE FOR THE SUCCEEDING TWO YEAR TERM.
- (C) ELECTIONS SHALL BE HELD IN JANUARY OF EACH TWO YEARS.

VACANCY, IF A VACANCY OCCURS, AN ELECTION SHALL BE HELD AT THE NEXT SCHEDULED MEETING.

DUTIES OF THE PRESIDENT AND VICE PRESIDENT (ONLY WHEN PRESIDENT IF NOT AVAILABLE):

- (A) THE PRESIDENT SHALL BE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER AND SHALL EXERCISE ALL DUTIES PERTAINING TO THE ARTICLES OF THIS CONSTITUTION.
- (B) PRESIDE AT ALL MEETINGS.
- (C) ENFORCE THE CONSTITUTION AND ITS ARTICLES.
- (D) MAY CALL A SPECIAL MEETING WHEN NECESSARY.
- (E) SHALL MAKE AND SIGN THE APPLICATIONS AND LEGAL FORMS NECESSARY FOR THE OPERATION FOR THE ASSOCIATION.
- (F) MAY APPOINT COMMITTEES FOR PURPOSES HE OR SHE DEEM NECESSARY.
- (G) SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL RECORDS AND APPLICATIONS WITHIN THE ASSOCIATION, AND MAKE SUCH RECORDS AVAILABLE TO THE OTHER OFFICERS.

DUTIES OF SECRETARY-TREASURER:

- (A) THE SECRETARY-TREASURER SHALL KEEP RECORDS OF ALL MONTHLY MEETINGS AND SPECIAL MEETINGS.

- (B) HAVE CUSTODY OF REPORTS AND DOCUMENTS CONNECTED WITH THE ASSOCIATION, INCLUDING OFFICES BEING HELD, APPLICATION FORMS AND COMMITTEES IN SERVICE.
- (C) NOTIFY NEW MEMBERS OF HIS OR HER ACCEPTANCE, AND FOLLOW UP WITH THE PROPER CREDENTIALS.
- (D) ISSUE NOTICES OF ALL MEETINGS.
- (E) FILE REPORTS (IF ANY) TO THE SECRETARY OF STATE, TO MAINTAIN THE ASSOCIATIONS STATUS IN GOOD STANDING WITH THE LAWS OF THE CITIES AND STATE OF MASSACHUSETTS.
- (F) SEE THAT ALL RECORDS AND DOCUMENTS IN HIS POSSESSION ARE MADE AVAILABLE TO THE OFFICERS OF THE ASSOCIATION UPON REQUEST.
- (G) MAINTAIN AN ACCURATE BANKING ACCOUNT THAT IS NECESSARY TO PURCHASE EMERGENCY EQUIPMENT AND OTHER VALUABLES NECESSARY FOR THE OPERATION OF THE ASSOCIATION.
- (H) SUBMIT A TREASURERS REPORT AT EACH MEETING TO THE MEMBERS OF THE ASSOCIATION.

DUTIES OF THE TWO BOARD MEMBERS:

- (A) THE DIRECTORS SHALL ASSIST THE OTHER OFFICERS TO ENHANCE THE STATUS OF THE ASSOCIATION.
- (B) ENFORCE THE CONSTITUTION AND ITS ARTICLES.
- (C) HAVE POWERS OVER THE PRESIDENT IN ANY OF THE ASSOCIATIONS FUNCTIONS EXCEPT PRESIDING AT MEMBERSHIP MEETINGS.

DUTIES OF THE CO-ORDINATOR:

- (A) THE CO-ORDINATORS DUTY SHALL BE TO KEEP THE INDIVIDUAL CITIES AND TOWNS PRESIDENTS INFORMED OF ANY NEW CHANGES THAT MAY OCCUR.
- (B) INITIATE NEW IDEAS AND SUGGESTIONS SO THAT THE OFFICERS AND MEMBERSHIP CAN CONSIDER ADDITIONS AND DELETIONS TO THE CONSTITUTION.
- (C) CALL MEETINGS OF ALL OFFICERS INVOLVED IN EACH CITY, IF A PARTICULAR SITUATION OCCURS AND NEEDS IMMEDIATE ATTENTION.

- (D) VOTES ONLY IF THERE IS A TIE VOTE, WHEN CITY OFFICERS FROM EACH CITY ARE PRESENT AT AN INTER-CITY MEETING, OR INDIVIDUAL CITY MEETINGS, FOR THE PURPOSES OF RATIFYING AN AMENDMENT OR A SITUATION THAT NEEDS IMMEDIATE ATTENTION.
- (E) CORRESPOND WITH OTHER CHARTERED ORGANIZATIONS AND GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS TO KEEP ABREAST ON WHAT NEEDS TO BE DONE TO IMPROVE THE COMMUNITY.

ARTICLE IV: THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS:

- (A) THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL CONSIST OF ALL THE OFFICERS OF THE ASSOCIATION.
- (B) THEY SHALL HAVE THE POWER TO CALL REGULAR MEETINGS AND SPECIAL MEETINGS OF THE DIRECTORS AT ANYTIME TO ENHANCE THE STATUS OF THE ASSOCIATION FOR ANY REASON.
- (C) THEY SHALL HAVE THE POWER TO CONDUCT BUSINESS AND AFFAIRS OF THE ASSOCIATION AFTER A MEETING OF THE GENERAL MEMBERSHIP HAS BEEN SANCTIONED BY A 51% VOTE OF WHOEVER IS PRESENT.
- (D) THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL EQUIPMENT PURCHASED BY THE ASSOCIATION, EXCEPT IN THE INSTANCE WHEN A MEMBER IS IN DIRECT CONTACT WITH THE ARTICLE.

ARTICLE V: THE MEMBERSHIP AND MEETINGS:

- (A) THE MEMBERSHIP SHALL CONSIST OF BOTH MALE AND FEMALE 18 YEARS AND OLDER. THESE PEOPLE SHALL HAVE THE INTEREST AND WELFARE OF THE CITIES AND TOWNS INVOLVED IN INTER-CITY "CB" ASSOCIATIONS OF MASSACHUSETTS. THEY SHALL ABIDE BY THE CONSTITUTION AND ITS AMENDMENTS FOR THE DURATION OF THEIR MEMBERSHIP. THEY SHALL ENCOURAGE AND REFER NEW MEMBERS TO THIS ASSOCIATION AND BECOME PARTIALLY RESPONSIBLE FOR THEIR ACTIONS.

- (B) THE MEETINGS SHALL BE CALLED ONCE A MONTH (ANY NIGHT THAT THE MEMBERS CAN AGREE FROM EACH CITY) FOR THE PURPOSE OF IMPROVING COMMUNICATIONS, VOTING ON NEW AMENDMENTS, KEEPING ABREAST OF NEW RADIO CODES AND ANY OTHER NEW BUSINESS THAT IS INTRODUCED FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE MEMBERSHIP. THEY SHALL BE CALLED BY ANY OFFICER OF THE ASSOCIATION BY A CHAIN PHONE, WORD OF MOUTH OR ANY OTHER MEANS THAT THE OFFICERS AGREE ON.
- (C) EACH MEETING SHALL HAVE THE FOLLOWING RULES OF ORDER:
1. ALL MOTIONS SHALL BE INTRODUCED ON THE FLOOR.
 2. NO MEMBER SHALL LEAVE WITHOUT PERMISSION FROM THE CHAIR.
 3. THE TIME LIMIT FOR ANY ONE SUBJECT IN ORDER WILL BE FIVE MINUTES. IF DEBATE ENSUES FROM THE SUBJECT, IT SHALL BE DONE IN A GENTLEMANLY FASHION AND WITHOUT MALICIOUS INTENT. ROBERTS' RULES OF ORDER WILL BE THE GOVERNING FACTOR OF DEBATE AND DISPUTE.
- (D) TO CONDUCT THE ORDER OF BUSINESS AT EACH MEETING THERE SHALL BE A QUORUM OF 51% OF THE MEMBERSHIP PRESENT.
- (E) EVERY MEMBER SHALL ATTEND AT LEAST ONE MEETING EVERY TWO MONTHS OR HE WILL BE DISMISSED FROM THE ASSOCIATION.
- (F) EACH MEETING SHALL HAVE:
1. READING OF THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING OF A QUORUM MEMBERSHIP.
 2. TREASURERS REPORT.
 3. ANY SPECIAL REPORTS OF OLD OR NEW BUSINESS.
 4. MOTIONS FOR ADJOURNMENT OF THE MEETING.

ARTICLE VI: NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS:

- (A) MEMBERS ARE ELIGIBLE TO OCCUPY ANY OFFICE IF HE IS IN GOOD STANDING WITH THE ASSOCIATION AFTER SIX (6) MONTHS OF SERVICE.
- (B) NOMINATIONS ARE TO BE MADE FROM THE FLOOR AT THE EXPIRING DATE OF THE OUT-GOING OFFICERS (JANUARY).

- (C) NOMINATIONS ARE TO BE FOR ONE POSITION AT A TIME AND NO MEMBER SHALL OCCUPY MORE THAN ONE OFFICE.
- (D) ELECTIONS SHALL BE HELD DIRECTLY AFTER THE NOMINATIONS ARE CAST AND SECONDED BY WRITTEN BALLOT. THE PRESIDENT SHALL APPOINT A THREE MEMBER COMMITTEE TO COUNT THE BALLOTS AND THE HIGHEST COUNT IS DECLARED THE WINNER FOR THAT OFFICE. THE NEWLY ELECTED OFFICERS SHALL TAKE OFFICE IMMEDIATELY, (JANUARY), AND SHALL ASSUME THE RESPONSIBILITY OF OLD BUSINESS AS WELL AS NEW BUSINESS.

ARTICLE VII: DUES:

- (A) THE DUES FOR THIS ASSOCIATION SHALL BE ONE DOLLAR (\$1.00) A MONTH PER MEMBER, STARTING AT THE FIRST MONTH OF ACCEPTANCE.
- (B) ANY MEMBER WHOSE DUES ARE IN ARREARS FOUR MONTHS OR MORE, SHALL BE NOTIFIED AND GIVEN ONE MONTH THEREAFTER TO REPLENISH HIS DEFICIENCY. IF THE MEMBER DOES NOT COMPLY WITH HIS PAST DUES, HE WILL BE DISMISSED FROM THE ASSOCIATION.

ARTICLE VIII: AMENDMENTS TO THE ARTICLES AND RULES OF
INTER-CITY "CB" ASSOCIATION OF MASSACHUSETTS:

- THE ARTICLES AND RULES OF THIS CONSTITUTION CAN BE AMENDED AT ANY SPECIAL OR REGULAR MEETING, PROVIDED:
- 1. THAT A WRITTEN NOTICE IS PRESENTED TO THE PRESIDENT AND PRESIDENTS OF EACH CITY TO READ TO THE MEMBERS.
 - 2. THAT A TWO-THIRDS MEMBERSHIP BE PRESENT TO VOTE ON THE AMENDMENT (BY BALLOT).
 - 3. IF THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT IS RATIFIED, THE OFFICERS WILL RECORD THAT AMENDMENT, IN THE ORIGINAL CONSTITUTION, AND ISSUE THAT NEW AMENDMENT TO THE MEMBERSHIP AT THE NEXT SCHEDULED MEETING.

RULES:

1. AT LEAST ONE MEMBER FROM EACH CITY SHALL MONITOR THEIR RESPECTIVE CITY CHANNEL FRIDAY, SATURDAY AND SUNDAY NIGHTS, FROM 7 P.M. TO 12 MIDNIGHT, FOR ANY EMERGENCY FROM MOBILE OR BASE UNITS.
2. ALL MOBILE AND BASE UNITS SHALL HAVE A COPY OF ASSOCIATION CODES IN THEIR POSSESSION AT ALL TIMES.
3. ALL MEMBERS SHALL USE THE MAIN CALL NUMBER ONLY, PRECEDED BY THE MONTH CALL LETTERS AND POLICE CODES FOR ANY SUBVERSIVE ACTIVITY TO THE POLICE STATIONS.
4. UNITS THAT ARE ON ANY SPECIAL PATROL (IF ANY) SHALL USE GOOD JUDGEMENT FOR STOPPING OR INVESTIGATING ANY MATTER THAT CONCERNS ASSOCIATION ACTIVITY.
5. ALL MEMBERS SHALL NOT DIVULGE THE SPECIAL CODES OR CALL LETTERS OF THE ASSOCIATION TO ANY NON-MEMBER.
6. IF ANY RULE OR ARTICLE OF THIS CONSTITUTION IS VIOLATED BY ANY MEMBER, IT SHALL BE JUST CAUSE FOR PROBATION OR DISMISSAL BY A BOARD OF JUDGES, FROM THE MEMBERSHIPS, APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT (IN ANY ONE CITY).
7. ANY MISCONDUCT ON THE RADIO OR AT MEETINGS, SHALL BE DEALT WITH BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS.
8. NO MEMBER SHALL USE ANY FIRE ARMS, OR ITEMS CONSIDERED WEAPONS BY LAW, WHILE HE OR SHE IS PERFORMING A FUNCTION ASSOCIATED WITH THIS CONSTITUTION.
