The joint Committee on Roads and Bridges, who were directed to "consider the expediency of prohibiting, by the enacting of a City Ordinance, the acceptance of any Streets which may hereafter be laid out, unless such Streets shall be laid out of such width as the City Council may determine upon in said Ordinance", have attended to that subject, and Report,

That, in their opinion, all streets more than two hundred feet in length should be not less than forty feet wide; that all streets less than two hundred feet in length should be not less than thirty feet wide; and that an Ordinance to that effect should be enacted. But, as the close of the present municipal year is so near, the Committee recommend that the further consideration of the subject be referred to the next City Council.

Report - Width of Streets.

25th July, 1851.

In the Year one thousand eight hundred & Fifty One.

An Ordinance relating to the laying out and acceptance of Streets.

Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of
Cambridge

- 1st All streets hereafter laid out, which shall be two hundred feet ^{or more} in length, shall be not less than forty feet wide; and all streets, not two hundred feet in length, shall be not less than thirty feet wide.
- 2nd No street shall hereafter be accepted unless it be of the width required in this Ordinance.
- 3rd All ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
