WHEREAS:

Jerome T. Lewis was a graduate of Colby College in 1945 and received his Bachelors Degree in Library Science from Simmons College in 1949 and has been an outstanding member of the Cambridge Library staff and distinguished himself by his work as Chairman of Black History Week and the Martin Luther King Memorial and has served the City of Cambridge as a member of the Civic Unity Committee, therefore be it

RESOLVED:

That the All Purpose Reading Room of the Cambridge Public Library be named the Jerome T. Lewis Room in honor of this distinguished son of Cambridge.
