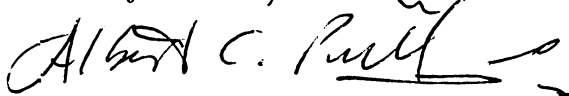
Dear Councillors of The Cambridge City Council:

Not long ago the Cambridge Rent Control Board refused to uphold one of our city laws, and even finding the party GUILTY, regarding the violation of MIT in refusing to uphold the full occupancy law as decreed by The Cambridge City Council Ordinances, on the also the matter of fines of \$500 per day to any party violating and disregarding also that other part of that law.

Will you please stand up for the upholding of the law and therefore repeal that Cambridge Rent Control decision on that matter, and or also therefore ask the Cambridge Rent Control Board to re-open that case so to execute the Cambridge Laws.

Otherwise other institutions and individuals would use that precedent in breaking further the Rent Control Laws of the City of Cambridge as meaning the taxpayers of Cambridge are not being served but just sucked to the marrows by vested interests and not so for non-profit & not so just educational schools that are taking over much of Cambridge left land that is urgently needed to build affordable housing for the working & low and middle income people, individuals, families and children of Cambridge.
