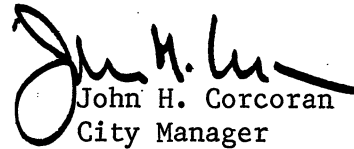

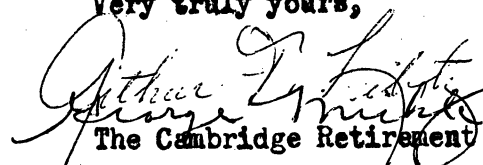

To The City Council:

The Retirement Board has received a copy of the Acts of 1971, Chapter 1094. If the City Council were to accept this Act, it would have a very serious effect on the Retirement System and the budget of the city. All retired employees would be entitled to similar treatment as that given to the person named in the special act. Otherwise, the act would constitute a special privileged legislation for one person.

It is, therefore, the request of the Retirement Board, that the City Council take no action on this Act until there can be a thorough investigation and report by the Retirement Board and the City Solicitor.

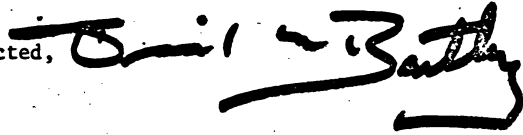
AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT RIGHTS OF AENEAS M. CASEY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

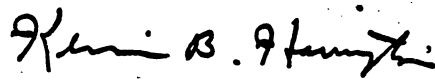
SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any provision of general or special law to the contrary, the city of Cambridge through its retirement board is hereby authorized to grant to Aeneas M. Casey, a former police officer, who is presently retired from said city, a non-contributory pension based on the current rate of regular pay in such an amount as is provided for police officers under section eighty-three A of chapter thirty-two of the General Laws.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its acceptance by the city of Cambridge and the pension authorized by section one of this act shall be paid on and after said effective date.
