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In Common Council Mch. 11th 1890.

Ordered, That a committee be appointed, to consist of three members of the Common Council, with such members as the Board of Aldermen may join, who shall select and appoint five citizens at large, to act as a committee to ascertain, and report as soon as practicable, the most desirable, practical means of procuring the removal of the steam Railroad tracks, which lie between the westerly side of Brookline Bridge, and the Northwly side of Broadway, and the probable cost thereof.
