- WHEREAS: This City Council wishes to recognize and commend outstanding and life-saving action on the part of its citizens; and
- WHEREAS: Ann Margaret Page, an 18 year old senior at Cambridge Rindge and Latin School who lives at 21 Blake Street, recently performed two cool-headed and quick thinking acts of first aid; and
- WHEREAS: Ann, who works as a waitress at the Massachusetts Avenue Ground Round Restaurant, saved the life of 5 year old Joseph McDowell (who also happens to be School Committeeman Joseph Maynard' grandson) on November 20th by performing the Heimlich Maneuver on the young boy as he was choking on his food; and
- WHEREAS: Ann's alertness and calmness saved the life of another young boy, 3 year old Scott Desjardins, on November 27th by performing the Heimlich Maneuver again in a similar situation; and
- WHEREAS: Ann learned the Heimlich Maneuver in her first aid classes at CRLS and owes a great deal of her attentiveness and competency to Michael Weaver, her physical education instructor; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record congratulating Ann Margaret Page on her life-saving alertness and poise in administering first aid to two young children in need; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and is hereby requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Ann Margaret Page on behalf of the entire City Council.
