RE: Discontinuance of distribution of funds from state lottery tickets

At the regular meeting of the Marlborough City Council held on Monday, December 8, 1975, the following resolution was passed by a unanimous vote:

RESOLVED:

That in the event that the State Legislature votes to discontinue the distribution of funds obtained from the sale of State lottery tickets, as has been the practice, that the sale of such tickets be banned within the limits of the city of Marlborough,

AND FURTHER,

That we advise the people of the City of Marlborough that they discontinue the purchase of such tickets until such time that the State Legislature reverses the decision to discontinue the distribution of such funds.

This resolution was submitted by Councilor Robert Rennie.

The Marlborough City Council would appreciate any effort your Board could take in support of these measures. We would also appreciate communications to your legislators informing them of any action that you may take. It is only through a concerted effort by all cities and towns in the Commonwealth that the State Legislature would be made aware of our feelings. As we are all concerned, any diversion of monies to help in the tax situation certainly would be detrimental. Therefore, we must take action to inform our legislators of our opposition to any legislation that would seek to divert funds from cities and towns to the State's General Fund.
